Mr. Chair

It is unfortunate that in many parts of the world minorities are being treated like slaves even in a number of developed countries. The recent incidents of massive surveillance, harassment, torture and extrajudicial killing of minorities particularly black community in the USA has demolished the artificial narrative of equality, tolerance and justice in the society.

The issues of killing of teenagers by Police in Missouri and a number of similar other incidents have raised serious questions with regard to the culture of impunity and lack of accountability.

Mr. chair,

During the presentation of the report to the. Human Rights Committee, the Committee expressed concern over racial disparities at different stages in the criminal justice system, sentencing disparities and the overrepresentation of individuals belonging to racial and ethnic minorities in prisons and jails. The Committee also raised concern about the practice of racial profiling and surveillance by law enforcement officials targeting certain ethnic minorities, Even the Committee has observed disparities in the imposition of death penalty that affects disproportionately African Americans.

We urge the international community and UN human rights machinery including Special Procedures to take notice these blatant human rights violations that are indeed based on discriminatory laws.
