My organization is part of over 7100 organizations including 218 ECOSOC Accredited organizations, across the world who make a joint Statement at United Nations under A/HRC/48/NGO/138, Calls for New United Nations Human Rights Council Resolution to Protect Tamils from Genocide.

We call upon the United Nations members and Agencies to:

- Recognize the genocide resolution passed unanimously in the Northern Provincial Council of Sri Lanka on 10th February, 2015. (A/HRC/48/NGO/138)
- Support a Resolution seeks an UN inquiry to investigate the genocide of the Tamil Nation in Sri Lanka by successive Sri Lankan Governments,
- to Refer Sri Lanka at the International Criminal Court.
- to appoint a Special Rapporteur to monitor and investigate ongoing human rights violations and repression against the Tamil Nation.
- The Sri Lankan government is still using the ban imposed on the LTTE by some countries as a tool to suppress the democratic voices and activities of the Tamil people in the North and East today even in the absence of the LTTE. Therefore, the countries concerned should take note of this and take appropriate action.
